
Benefits to the Store as a digital-first model

- Increased market share from 30% to 80%
- Increased sales from \$5.6M to \$9.5M in year one and \$10.6M in year two
- Significant improvements in operational and fiscal efficiencies
- Reduced employee stress resulting in improved staff well-being

Benefitting our students

- Prior to Equitable Access only 22% of UC Davis students had access to all of their textbooks vs.
 80% today
- 78% of participating students report that Equitable
 Access is more convenient than the traditional
 textbook model
- Adds and drops that previously would have required 65,000 physical exchanges was reduced to only 11,000 thanks to digital-first which enabled those events to happen automatically
